PLAKSHA UNIVERSITY - UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION POLICY

Plaksha University aims to select applicants who have the academic background and aptitude to succeed in our undergraduate programs. The following undergraduate admission policy outlines the criteria and pre-requisites for applicants seeking admission to our university.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for admission to an undergraduate program at Plaksha University, applicants must meet the following criteria:

Educational Background

Applicants should be currently enrolled in or have successfully completed grade 12 or an equivalent qualification from a recognised national or international board.

Subject Pre-requisites: Mathematics and Physics

All majors at Plaksha University have a strong foundation in mathematics, physics, and computing. Therefore, it is mandatory for students to have studied Mathematics until grade 12.

While not mandatory, it is highly recommended for students to have studied Physics until grade 12.

Accepted Boards

Plaksha University accepts applicants from all recognized national and international educational boards, including but not limited to CBSE, ISC, IB, IGCSE, State Boards, and others.

For applicants from an International Baccalaureate (IB) background, the following additional policies apply:

- Applicants are eligible to apply if they have successfully completed the IB Diploma Programme (DP).
- Applicants taking the IB Certificate Course must meet the subject pre-requisites and have taken a minimum of six subjects, including three Standard Level and three Higher Level courses.
- IB Career-related Programme (CP) applicants must have subject pre-requisites in alignment with their DP courses to be considered for admission.
- The following variants of Mathematics:
 - Analysis and Approaches: Higher Level (HL) and Standard Level (SL)

• Applications and Interpretations: Higher Level (HL)

Required Scores

Grade X

- National, State Boards: The best of five scores will be considered, including Math and Science.
- IGCSE Boards: A minimum of five A-Level subjects including Math and one science subject
- IB Boards: Six scores will be considered including Math and one science subject

Grade XII

- National and State Boards: The best of four scores will be considered, including Math (and Physics if studied).
- IGCSE Boards: A minimum of three A-Level subjects.
- IB Boards: All six scores will be considered, including Math (and Physics if studied).

Test Scores for Admission Offer

To be eligible for a confirmed offer of admission, applicants are required to submit <u>at least</u> <u>one</u> of the following scores with their application:

- ✓ Grade 12th (or equivalent) Board Results
- ✓ Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT)
- ✓ American College Testing (ACT)
- ✓ Joint Entrance Examination (JEE) Main

Students who apply using only predicted scores are eligible for a <u>conditional offer</u> of admission.

ADMISSIONS PROCESS

An applicant can apply only once in any of the rounds of the Admissions cycle 2023-24. Applicants are encouraged to apply early, so that they receive their decision earlier.

- Applicants are required to fill and submit an online form (available free of charge on the website)
- All applicants are required to upload copies of official transcripts for standardized tests and board scores.
- The choice of preferred major specified in the application form is **only indicative in nature**. Students can change their major after they have successfully completed the common three semester curriculum.
- Based on the information provided and the merit of the application, candidates will be shortlisted for a one – on- one virtual interaction

- An overall assessment of the application will be carried out and a final decision will be communicated after completion of the process.
- The Financial Aid form will be open to candidates only after they have been shortlisted for the interview round.
- Admission decisions will be communicated to candidates after the assessment of applications received in each round.
- The decisions taken by the Admissions Committee are final. Requests for reevaluation will not be considered.
